Four to Five Million Californians' Coverage At Risk **Under ACA Repeal: Data by Congressional District**

Over five million Californians directly rely on the resources provided by the Affordable Care Act, either to get their coverage through the Medicaid (Medi-Cal) expansion, or to get financial assistance to afford and buy private health insurance through Covered California. The Republican ACA repeal proposals would threaten this assistance, and fundamentally change a 50-year federal and state Medicaid funding partnership, ultimately shifting hundreds of billions of costs to states. GOP proposals would cut federal funding for new Medicaid enrollees and cap money for the entire program, resulting in a \$30 billion annual cut to Medi-Cal within a decade. Not only would these proposals functionally eliminate Medicaid expansion funding, they would also cut federal funding for premium subsidies for the 1.5 million Californians that buy their coverage in Covered California, forcing many to pay much more for far less coverage. Passage of any of the currently proposed Republican bills would result in millions of consumers being left in a smaller and sicker insurance pool, with skyrocketing premiums as a result. The chart below details enrollment by California Congressional district with the best and most recent available estimates from 2016.
