

## Over Five Million Californians' Coverage At Risk Under ACA Repeal: Data by Congressional District

Over five million Californians currently benefit from and directly rely on health care coverage and financial assistance made possible by the Affordable Care Act (ACA) either through Medicaid (Medi-Cal) expansion or buying private health insurance in Covered California. Federal ACA repeal proposals, such as the American Health Care Act (AHCA) passed by the GOP House on May 4, 2017, threaten our state's coverage gains and reductions to our uninsured rate. These proposals would have fundamentally changed a 50-year federal and state Medicaid funding partnership while shifting hundreds of billions of costs to states. They would eliminate federal funding for the Medicaid expansion as well as premium subsidies for those who buy coverage through Covered California, forcing many to pay much more in premiums for far less coverage. Passage of any of these proposals would result in millions of consumers being left in a smaller and sicker insurance pool with skyrocketing premiums. **This chart details ACA programs enrollment by California Congressional district with the most recent 2017 Medi-Cal beneficiary estimates and 2018 Covered California enrollees.** It does not quantify the people with pre-existing conditions or other patients benefiting from ACA consumer protections that are also at risk in these proposals.
