

Covered California: Enrollment and Health Insurance Premiums Data

Covered California is a vital part of California's health care system that nearly 1.4 million rely on. After the passage of the Affordable Care Act (ACA), Covered California was established in 2013 as the nation's first state-based health insurance marketplace and a place where consumers can shop, compare, and buy individual insurance coverage that includes essential health benefits and consumer protections. Despite recent federal actions to undermine the individual health insurance market, including the votes for the 2017 federal tax reform bill that removed the individual mandate penalty, Covered California has remained relatively stable with only moderate premium increases. In 2019, premiums will increase an average of 8.7%ⁱ – around half of which is due to uncertainty created by federal actionsⁱⁱ. Those who do not qualify for federal tax credits will bear the full burden of this increase. **This chart details enrollment in Covered California by congressional district and their annual net increase in premiums for 2019.**
